
Over 500 individuals attended the Southeast Asia Food and Agriculture Sustainability Symposium

### Southeast Asia Food and Agriculture Sustainability Symposium

On 17 Dec 21, Minister for Sustainability and the Environment Ms Grace Fu spoke at the Southeast Asia Food and Agriculture Sustainability Symposium. Minister Fu shared how Singapore has been harnessing technology and innovation, and reinvigorating farming spaces and infrastructure to meet our '30 by 30' goal of producing 30 per cent of Singapore's nutritional needs locally and sustainably by 2030.

## 17<sup>th'</sup> Joint Council for Bilateral Cooperation

On 29 Dec 21, Minister of State (MOS) for Sustainability and the Environment Desmond Tan participated in the 17<sup>th</sup> Joint Council for Bilateral Cooperation (JCBC) alongside Deputy Prime Minister Heng Swee Keat and other Cabinet Ministers. Singapore and China reaffirmed their bilateral cooperation, including in efforts towards green and low-carbon development. Singapore's Ministry of Sustainability and the Environment and China's Ministry of Ecology and Environment adopted a new Joint Paper to pursue green and low-carbon development in resource optimisation and climate action. The two Ministries will advance cooperation in plastic and e-waste management, low-carbon technologies, and explore lowcarbon demonstration districts. Both countries will also continue to work closely at the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), the Belt and Road Initiative International Green Development Coalition (BRIGC), the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD), and the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN).
